This first-hand account by women's advocate Dianne Porter gives readers an inside perspective on the tireless efforts of building women's equality on Prince Edward Island. With profiles of front-liners in the fields of early childhood education, politics and social services, Porter honours the "unsung heroes" who collectively were able to transform the landscape, and shape the future for all women who came after.

Dianne Porter was a founding member of the Canadian Child Care Federation and the first Executive Director of the P.E.I. Interministerial Women's Secretariat. Dianne is a member of the Order of P.E.I. Advisory Council, and has made it her life's work to improve the lives of women. Dianne has worked as a lecturer in gender studies at Carleton University, and in leadership roles at Red River Community College and Holland College.
